

Who is DESTINY RESCUE?

- · International, Christian nonprofit founded in 2001.
- Destiny Rescue is committed to rescuing kids from human trafficking and sexual exploitation and equipping them to stay free. Once rescued, each survivor's next steps follow one of three paths: enrollment in a personalized Destiny Rescue Freedom Plan™, reunified with family or entrusted to a government agency or another local organization.
- Thousands of children have been rescued, and hundreds of perpetrators have been arrested worldwide.

WHERE DOES DESTINY RESCUE WORK?

Destiny Rescue facilitates rescue in five regions across Asia, Africa and Latin America

Two African regions

Eastern Africa: Kenya and Uganda Southern Africa: Zimbabwe

Two Asian regions

South Asia: Nepal and another country Southeast Asia: Cambodia, the Philippines, Thailand and another country

• One Latin American region Dominican Republic

* Some countries are not named publicly to protect survivors and staff

HOW ARE CHILDREN RESCUED?

Our agents work tirelessly using a variety of tactics to find exploited children and then remove them from harm, at times in collaboration with law enforcement.

Tactics to locate exploited children could include:

- Undercover or online investigations
- Canvassing and building trust within high-risk communities
- · Conducting interviews at trafficking hotspots
- Acting upon information brought to us by individuals or agencies

Once found, each rescue can look very different depending on the situation at hand, but our most common rescue operation types are:

- Raids and law enforcement collaboration
 Rescue teams participate in case-building and rescue operations in collaboration with law enforcement.
- Covert operations and rapport building
 Covert agents work undercover, or field agents
 work in high-risk communities to build trust,
 then rescue children trapped in exploitation.
- Border and transit monitoring
 Rescue agents monitor routes out of the country, stop and interview travelers and rescue individuals from active trafficking situations.

Rescuing children is our primary mission. However, in our pursuit of rescuing kids, adults are often rescued alongside them.

HOW DOES DESTINY RESCUE HELP EQUIP SURVIVORS TO STAY FREE?

Post-rescue, a survivor's next steps are determined based on his or her unique situation, including the vulnerabilities that led to exploitation and local legal procedure.

A survivor's next steps follow one of three paths:

- Enrollment in an individualized Destiny Rescue Freedom Plan™ implemented in one of our residential homes or through our Community Care program, which enables the child to live at home while participating in services. Freedom Plans include health checks, trauma resilience training and economic empowerment solutions.
- Reunification with family, which may include international travel, accommodation curation and assistance with legal documentation. In some cases, we can follow up with survivors in the months after reunification.
- Entrusted to government agencies and their standard processes or another local organization offering appropriate services.
 Follow-up in these circumstances is limited as organizations and governments work to protect children and their privacy.

DOES DESTINY RESCUE SHARE THE GOSPEL WITH SURVIVORS?

It is our goal to share the gospel and love of God with every survivor who enters our care.

This looks different from survivor to survivor and from nation to nation. We intentionally protect our teams and survivors who live in regions that have any level of hostility toward Christianity.
